Section A Hall of Fame (HOF)

1. Purpose

The purpose is to honor, pay tribute to and perpetuate the names of those BASCW members who have contributed to the growth and welfare of the sport of bowling by their bowling proficiency and/or meritorious service.

2. Membership

Membership shall be determined by annual election hereinafter described. No participant may gain automatic entry. Admittance will be considered through written nomination only. See Appendix A for Nomination Forms.

3. HOF Coordinator

The HOF Coordinator shall be responsible for the following duties:

- a. Qualify Review the qualification of all nominees.
- b. Ceremony Obtain the individual awards to be presented to those elected and for the presentation ceremony.
- c. Celebration All activities associated with the celebration function. The HOF Coordinator may be a member of the Board or may be an Ad Hoc Member appointed by the Board.

4. Nominations

Nomination of a candidate for election to the HOF can be made by any BASCW Member with the following stipulations:

- a. All qualifications and achievements of the candidates must accompany the nomination as prescribed hereinafter and must be accepted no later than August 1st of the current year.
- b. Nominations must be submitted to the HOF Coordinator or dropped in the BASCW Mailbox at the Johnson Bowling Center.

5. Qualifications

Nominees must be, or have been in the past, a BASCW member for at least 5 years. Nominees must have bowled in BASCW events for a total of five (5) seasons (21 games). Other qualifications to be considered are dedication, leadership, personality and any other additional achievements. Posthumous candidates will also be considered.

6. Categories

- a. Proficiency (10 Pin) A male participant must have maintained an average of 190 or higher and a female participant must have maintained an average of 170 or higher for three (3) consecutive years in a sanctioned SCW league.
- b. Proficiency (9 Pin No Tap) A male participant must have maintained an average of 250 and a female participant must have maintained an average of 215 or higher for three (3) consecutive years bowling in BASCW events.
- c. Meritorious A nominee must have demonstrated exemplary volunteer services to enhance and promote the sport of bowling in SCW. Other qualifications to be considered are dedication, leadership, personality and any other additional achievements.

7. Election

Each year, the Board shall determine the number of nominees for all award categories.

The HOF Coordinator will submit the HOF candidates at the September Board of Directors Meeting where the BASCW Board will hold the election of the candidates.

In order to be selected, a nominee must receive a majority of votes by the Board members.

Section B No Tap Bowling

1. No Tap Description

NO TAP bowling is the felling of nine (9) pins on the first ball (any frame). This is recorded as a "No-Tap Strike".

2. Who and When

Bowling is only open to BASCW members and their guests. Guests may only bowl twice in one calendar year. No-Tap bowling is conducted on alternate Saturdays from January through December as scheduled by the Board and Johnson Lanes.

3. Costs

The cost per participant is determined by the Board. Payment accepted is by check, payable to BASCW, or cash. All entries must be paid prior to the start of the event.

4. Guests

A participant must be a SCW member or an authorized guest of a BASCW member. Guests are not permitted to receive any prize money or payout. The guest fee will be set by the Board.

5. Average and Handicap

Participants' averages will be re-established at the first event of every new calendar year. For those who bowled in the previous calendar year, they will keep their end of year average for 9 games then those 9 games will establish their average for the next game and updated after each game after that. If a participant did not bowl in the previous calendar year, their average will be determined by bowling three (3) games in a Saturday No Tap. Averages are adjusted per event the same as regular leagues. Handicap will be calculated as 100% of the difference between a participant's average and 260.

6. Prize Money and Payout

All prize money will be collected and placed into four (4) Divisions in accordance with No-Tap Averages as follows:

Division 1: Men 186-300

Division 2: Men 0-185

Division 3: Women 151-300

Division 4: Women 0-150

Payouts will be in accordance with the BASCW No-Tap Payout Schedule for each Division. All prize funds will be distributed at the following No-Tap Event.

Members who have become inactive must collect their payouts prior to the end of the calendar year.

Section C Lane Assignments

1. Sign-Up

Members can sign up for a No-Tap event by any of the following:

- a. Advanced Payment during a No-Tap event, participants must write their name on the Advanced Payment Sheets and place their payment in the Payment Envelope. Once all participants have completed their Payment Envelope, it should be placed in the BASCW Mailbox located on the right-hand side of the Bowler's Table.
- b. Mailbox Registration Participants can sign up in the book located behind the bowler's table in the middle of the bowling center. They must write their name and place their payment in the envelope. Payment Envelopes must then be placed in the mailbox on the right-hand side of the Bowler's Table. The deadline for mailbox signups is the Wednesday night prior to the next No-Tap event.
- c. Walk-in Registration Participants can still bowl by showing up early the day of the event. Walk-in participants must register with, and make payment to, the Lane Coordinator prior to the start of bowling.
- d. Lane Assignments Six (6) bowlers per lane may be assigned. First choice for Lane Assignments are the advanced payment participants, then mailbox, then walk-ins. Pending availability, mailbox and walk-in registrations are not guaranteed. BASCW Members have priority over non-members. The Lane Assignment Coordinator has final say regarding all lane assignments.

2. Cancellations

Notification to cancel must be given by noon on the Thursday prior to the event or payment is subject to forfeiture. Notification may be given by placing a note in the Mailbox or contacting the Lane Assignment Coordinator. Contact information for the Lane Assignment Coordinator is provided on the BASCW Club Information Bulletin Board behind the Bowler's Table.

3. Carryovers

Carryovers will be allowed for any unexpected conflict, illness, injury, family emergency, mechanical failure or power outages. The Lane Coordinator has the final say on whether or not the participant is allowed a carryover.

Section D Membership

Membership is for SCW residents only; a current SCW Recreation Card is required. To become a member, fill out a Membership Form (Appendix C) and follow the instructions on the form. Membership forms can be found at the Bowler's Table or on the BASCW Website: BASCW.net.

Section E Side Events

1. Description

- a. 3-6-9 is the felling of nine (9) or more pins on the first ball of the third (3rd), sixth (6th) and ninth (9th) frame of a single line of bowling. This is recorded as a "3-6-9 qualification" for that line of bowling.
- b. 4-6-8 is the felling of nine (9) or more pins on the first ball or picking up a spare (felling of all 10 pins after two balls) in any two frames of the fourth (4th), sixth (6th) and eighth (8th) frames of a single line of bowling. This is recorded as a "4-6-8 qualification" for that line of bowling. This game is only open to participants in Division 2 and Division 4.
- c. A 300 game is the felling of nine (9) or more pins in each of the 12 frames of a single line of bowling. This is recorded as a "300 game qualification" for that line of bowling.
- d. Separate forms for 3-6-9 and 4-6-8 will be distributed to each lane and 300 game forms will be provided to each participant at registration prior to bowling. It is the participant's responsibility to ensure: the participant's name is written on the provided forms and must be placed in the In-Box on the Bowler's Table at the conclusion of bowling on each pair of lanes. It is the responsibility of one person on each pair of lanes to see that this form is properly submitted. Any awards won will be forfeited if either their name was omitted, or the form not turned in.
- e. Guests are not permitted to participate in these events.

2. When

The 3-6-9, 4-6-8, and 300 events are conducted during No-Tap events as scheduled by the Board. A participant registers with the 3-6-9, 4-6-8, and/or the 300 Game Coordinator prior to the start of bowling.

3. Costs

A participant may register for these events at an additional cost determined by the Board.

4. Prize Money and Payout

For 3-6-9 and 4-6-8, the individual prize funds include all entry fees collected at a No-Tap event. The prize fund is divided into shares by dividing the prize fund by the total number of qualifiers rounded down to a full dollar amount. The remainder is carried over to the next event.

All 300 Game entry fees collected at a No-Tap event incorporate the prize fund. The prize fund is divided into shares by dividing the prize fund by the total number of qualifiers. If no 300 Game is bowled at this event, the money is carried over and added to the Prize Fund for the next event.

Qualifying registered participants are paid according to the number of shares each participant wins. Payment is made at the following No-Tap event.

Members who have become inactive must collect side events funds prior to the end of the calendar year.

Section F Summer Red Pin Bowling

1. Summer Red Pin (SRP) Description

SRP bowling consists of colored pins being randomly placed among the usual white pins.

2. When

SRP bowling is conducted on Tuesdays at 1:00 pm, following the winter leagues, as scheduled by the Board and Johnson Lanes. Sign up for the next event is conducted at the beginning of the current event. Participants may also sign-up at the Bowler's Table before Sunday noon preceding the actual event.

3. Costs

The cost per participant is determined by the Board. Payment accepted is cash or a check payable to BASCW. Payment for this event is collected the day of the event prior to the start of bowling.

4. Prize Money and Payout

Participants are awarded "chips" for a variety of bowling tasks associated with the red pins as stated in the Red Pin Payout Rules Table, see Appendix D. One frame could collect multiple awards ranging from one chip to twenty chips. When a frame has been completed and the result meets the qualification in the Red Pin Payout Rules Table, the participant collects the appropriate amount of chips, the collection of chips is on the honor system. Each chip is worth one quarter. Upon completion of bowling, the participant must cash out the chips for cash at the Bowler's Table.

Section G Special Events

Special bowling events will be held at various times as determined by the Board.
